

Robert McCauley was a successful builder in the Rochester community. He built his family's home in Webster, creating a workshop in the garage, handcrafting furniture and a drop-down movie projector, and adding on a suite for his daughter and her children. When severe heart problems took Bob out of work and piled on hospital bills, he fell behind on mortgage payments and came close to losing the home he had worked so hard to build.

With the help of The Housing Council at PathStone, Bob and his wife, Deb, were able to secure a loan modification, which reduced his interest rate and made mortgage payments affordable. Today, Bob continues to take on home improvement projects and enjoys having his family close by.

INEZ BURNS KETTLES | Rochester, NY

Inez Burns Kettles has lived in her home near the City of Rochester Public Market since 1994, where she raised her children and ran a daycare. She continues to throw neighborhood gatherings in the community garden she maintains next to her lot. A combination of factors, including her oldest child's sickle cell anemia and her own medical issues, led Inez to fall behind on mortgage payments. Despite attempts to rectify her account becoming delinquent, the bank refused to accept her payments.

With The Housing Council at PathStone by her side, Inez was able to navigate the process with the bank, receive loan modifications, and avoid foreclosure. The Housing Council took the weight off her shoulders and empowered her to stay in her beloved home, where she loves hosting friends and neighbors.

ORLANDO ORTIZ

Landlord and The Housing Council **Board Chairperson**

Orlando Ortiz feels strongly that landlords are a vital part of Rochester's community and that helping them provide safe, affordable homes to tenants, benefits everyone in that community. That's because he is a landlord himself.

"When I buy units, I ask myself, 'Would I like to live here?'" says Ortiz, who first connected with The Housing Council at PathStone in 2014 and who now serves as its Board Chairperson. "Your home is something you should be proud of, and that's what I try to offer my tenants."

Ortiz also acknowledges the importance of The Housing Council's other programs, like homeownership and foreclosure prevention. He cites the number of classes now offered in Spanish, which addresses the needs of Rochester's Spanishspeaking population — a population that has seen a boom recently, in part because of Hurricane Maria.

Perhaps most inspiring of all is the number of people that The Housing Council has helped on the road to homeownership, whether they live in those homes with their families or rent out units.

Ortiz adds, "Kids being able to come home to a safe environment is part of a healthy lifestyle and the landlord training we provide is ultimately for the betterment of the tenants, too."

JAIME SAUNDERS

President & CEO, United Way of Greater Rochester

Jamie Saunders has partnered professionally with The Housing Council for over 35 years — first as the CEO of Willow Domestic Violence Center, and today with the United Way of Greater Rochester. She has witnessed time and again the impact that THC's services have had on countless Rochester residents.

"The Housing Council recognizes that a home is more than four walls," Saunders explains. "It is also a place where we break bread, make connections, refuel and replenish before going back out into the world. It is safety, consistency, and not having to worry. For people with families, a home represents a critical component of being an active, present parent. A home means belonging in the neighborhood and having the ability to contribute to the community in a meaningful way."

When she thinks about local organizations that enable families in crisis to obtain or maintain stable housing, Saunders says that The Housing Council at PathStone is the first to come to mind.

"Here at the United Way, we focus on reducing poverty and improving quality of life for our clients, and The Housing Council is a key component of that mission. Their care, their integrity, and effectiveness of what they do are unmatched."

FORECLOSURE PREVENTION

One goal of The Housing Council at PathStone is to assist homeowners who are facing foreclosure. Our Foreclosure Prevention Counselors will:

- · Explain the foreclosure process in New York State
- Explore the options for people who are behind on their mortgage or having difficulty making payments
- · Review the client's monthly expenses and income
- · Create an action plan
- · Liaise with lenders to resolve issues and remove obstacles

FIRST-TIME HOMEBUYERS SERVICES

Buying your first home is an exciting process, but it can also be a daunting one. The Housing Council's Homeownership Counselors educate and empower first-time buyers by offering:

- · Monthly orientation sessions for first-time homebuyers
- · In-depth, one-on-one counseling sessions
- · Education regarding grant programs
- · Regular classes that cover all aspects of the homebuying process

Our hotline operators can answer any questions related to housing. It's available Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday from 1 p.m.



SERVICES

We offer apartment listings, important information for renters, an explanation of tenants' rights and responsibilities, and assistance for victims of housing discrimination.



LANDLORD SERVICES

Landlords can list properties on our Rental Registry, attend property management workshops, schedule DHS inspections, and avail themselves of many other resources related to owning and operating rental property.



ADDITIONAL SERVICES

We also provide help with emergency housing, reverse mortgage counseling for seniors, assistance with applications for Lake Ontario Flood Relief information about home repair and improvement grants, and referrals to other community resources




