The great Rochestarian Frederick Douglass said, "Every man who thinks at all, must know that home is the fountainhead, the inspiration, the foundation, and main support, not only of all social virtue but of all motives to human progress, and that no people can prosper, or amount to much unless they have a home or the hope of a home." This is why we believe community starts at home.

## **OUR MISSION**

The Housing Council at PathStone serves to increase successful homeownership and tenancy experiences for low-to-moderate-income residents in Monroe County and surrounding counties. Grant programs are administered for local municipalities, New York State, private foundations, and federal programs.

The Housing Council at PathStone provides housing counseling and intervention services for tenants, and homeowners, plus comprehensive assistance and direct training to landlords. In addition, the agency maintains a Housing Hotline, promotes fair housing awareness, publishes a rental registry, and provides inspection services for rental programs.

The Housing Council at PathStone is proud to help over 8,000 households annually.



In July of 1964, social unrest and riots swept through Rochester. The racial disparities in housing and job opportunities led community leaders to form The Housing Council in 1971. Since then, the organization created life-changing programs that provided community members and residents with access to experts, resources, and the knowledge needed to address mortgage defaults, to purchase a home, to educate landlords and tenants on fair and quality housing, and to help those who are homeless. Through recessions, housing crises, and the recent pandemic, The Housing Council has remained committed to providing for Rochester community members and their needs.

Safe and affordable housing is at the heart of a healthy community. For 50 years, The Housing Council has been at the forefront of creating access and opportunities for residents in the Monroe County area to navigate the steps to successful homeownership and receive tenancy and landlord support, resources, and guidance.

The Housing Council is proud to have reached our 50-year milestone of serving Monroe County area residents! Every day our team works to provide opportunities for families and individuals to access healthy and safe housing. With our services and support, community members have been able to build strong foundations for themselves and their families.

## **FORECLOSURE PREVENTION**

The Housing Council at PathStone assists homeowners facing foreclosure. Our Foreclosure Prevention Counselors work directly with homeowners to ensure they:

- Understand the foreclosure process in New York State
- Know that there are options if they are behind on their mortgage or having difficulty making payments
- Have a full review of their monthly expenses and income
- Create an action plan to achieve success
- Remove obstacles and resolve any issues they may have with their lenders









#### Housing Hotline

Our Housing Hotline is available to assist with a variety of housing questions. To speak to a HUD Certified Housing Counselor, check out our website for contact options and current hours of availability.

#### Tenant Services

We offer apartment listings, important information for renters, an explanation of tenants' rights and responsibilities, and guidance for victims of housing discrimination.

#### **Landlord Services**

The Housing Council at PathStone offers comprehensive services to landlords — from property management courses to inspection assistance and apartment listings. Landlords can list properties on our Rental Registry, attend property management workshops, schedule DHS inspections, and avail themselves of many other resources related to owning and operating rental property.


#### Additional Services

We help with emergency housing, reverse mortgage counseling for seniors, information about home repair and improvement grants, and referrals to other community resources.

### FIRST-TIME HOMEBUYERS SERVICES

We offer education, counseling, and assistance needed to make the dreams of future homeowners a reality. The Housing Council's Homeownership Counselors educate first-time buyers by offering:

- Monthly Homebuyer education courses for first-time homebuyers
- In-depth, one-on-one counseling sessions
- Education regarding grant programs
- Regular classes that cover all aspects of the homebuying process



The Housing Council at PathStone believes that a safe, stable home is where community begins. The impact that The Housing Council has made over the last 50 years comes from helping community members reach and maintain their dream of being a homeowner.

As more people face foreclosures, evictions, and homelessness, The Housing Council remains ready to provide support and resources to those in need. We continue to offer classes, promote fair housing awareness, assist with grant applications, and connect people to community resources to help residents find, afford, maintain, and keep their homes. The Housing Council is a cornerstone of our community.

#### Responding to the Pandemic

In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, The Housing Council at PathStone quickly pivoted from in-person services to remote work arrangements to keep staff and their families safe, while still providing high-level service to our clients and community partners.

Following the mandates of our state and local governments, The Housing Council implemented remote access technology, such as the use of at home computers and devices, online communication platforms, and web-based education platforms.

Communication access is vital, so we created online platforms for program intake and scheduling, immediately utilized email, phone, and social channels for answering questions, and solved issues faced by our community. We also mailed documents directly to applicants with self-addressed stamped envelopes for easy document submissions.

One-on-one counseling sessions are now provided via phone or teleconference and Homebuyer Education Classes are offered via eHome America and Zoom. As we continue to face the pandemic, our team is constantly assessing the needs of the community to provide best practices, and delivering crucial services in times of crisis.




## IN 2021, OUR TEAM HELPED:


- **85 homeowners** at risk of foreclosure bring their housing debt current.
